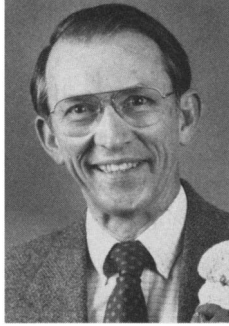

Awards and Honors. . .

Robert Marshall can now claim the title of "Mizzou's" ice cream man". Marshall has been appointed Arbuckle Professor and leader of the University of Missouri-Columbia's newly established laboratory for teaching and research on ice cream and frozen desserts. The laboratory is partially supported by the W. S. Arbuckle Endowment established in honor of the 1940 University of Missouri graduate who gained worldwide recognition as an ice cream authority.



Marshall is a Past President of the American Dairy Science Association and has received teaching awards from the Milk Industry Foundation, AMOCO, and the International Milk, Food and Environmental Sanitarians. He has received research awards from Dairy Research Incorporated and Gamma Sigma Delta.

Advisers to the Arbuckle Laboratory include representatives of the International Ice Cream Association, Missouri Ice Cream and Milk Institute, Baskin-Robbins, Mid-American Dairyman, Incorporated, the Kroger Co., Midland United Dairy Industries Association, Beck Flavors, Germantown Manufacturing Co., Technology Application and Management Co., Pevely Dairy Co., and Mrs. Wendell Arbuckle.

Call for Speakers and Papers. . .

There will be a National Conference on Dairy Feeding Systems Focusing on Design and Management, January 10-12, 1990, in Harrisburg, PA. The application-oriented conference is intended to provide an overview of current technology on feeds and feeding systems for dairy farms.

Symposium topics include feed storage and handling, nutrition of dairy cattle (milking, dry, and heifers), health and management, economics, and case studies (new farm systems, adaptation of existing facilities to modern

systems, ration design, labor utilization).

The audience is primarily dairymen, farm advisors, feed suppliers, farm builders, manufacturers of feeding equipment, herd health practitioners, agricultural lenders, and others concerned with the production, storage, handling, formulation, and delivery of feed for dairy cattle.

Proposals should be submitted by sending a title and summary of the proposed topic (or telephoning this information) by April 7 to Martin Sailus, NRAES Manager, Northeast Regional Agricultural Engineering Service, Riley-Robb Hall, Cooperative Extension, Ithaca, NY 14853 (607/255-7654). Accepted papers must be submitted by November 1, 1989.

The conference is sponsored by the Northeast Dairy Practices Council, American Society of Agricultural Engineers, and Northeast Regional Agricultural Engineering Service.

Confectioners Establish Fellowship. . .

The Pennsylvania Manufacturing Confectioners Association has committed \$100,000 to endow a fellowship for graduate students in Pennsylvania State University's College of Agriculture.

The award will be made to outstanding students in the Food Science Department whose studies focus on confectionery science and technology. Each fellowship will pay tuition and other academic expenses and provide a living stipend. It will be renewable for the length of the student's graduate program, on condition that he or she make satisfactory academic progress.

The fellowship also would recognize past leaders of the Pennsylvania Manufacturing Confectioners Association. The first student to receive the award would be known as the Dr. Rodney C. Welch Graduate Fellow in Confectionery Science and Technology. Welch, a Penn State alumnus, served for many years in various leadership roles with the association and was influential in its educational and research efforts. Subsequent awards would honor other leaders, as determined by the association.

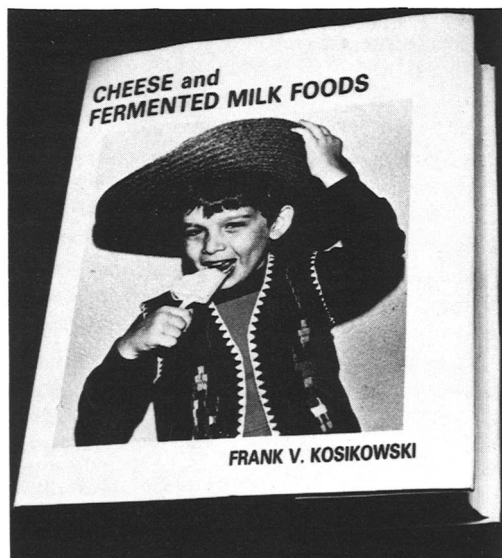
